Timetable

8 th November and 15 th January As determined by the Local Authority	Window to apply for school place in Reception and year 3 Your child will be 3 or have just turned 4 when you apply
15 th January	Deadline for Submitting applications to be allocated on National Offer day All applications received after 15 th January will be treated as late and will only be processed after all on-time applications
16 th April (or the next working day where 16 th April falls on a weekend or bank holiday)	National Offer Day Parents/carers are informed of outcome of application
Maximum 20 days after date of Offer	Deadline by when appeals should be lodged If your appeal is received later than the timeline detailed, it will still be dealt with but it may not be heard before the end of the Summer Term.
Appeals lodged within 20 days of date of Offer will be heard by the end of Summer Term	Appeals heard for those lodged by the deadline and where possible
September onwards	Appeals received after 20 days from date of Offer will be classed as a late Appeal
