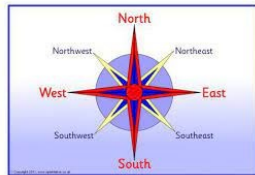

### Core knowledge for this unit

**Name and locate 7 continents of the world.** (Year 1 name and locate 5 continents in the world)

*South America, North America, Asia, Australia, Europe, Africa, Antarctica*

**Name and locate the 5 oceans of the world.** (Year 1 name 2-3 oceans) *Southern, pacific, Arctic, Atlantic, Indian*

**Describe 1 physical feature of each of the continents.** Desert, forest, mountains, grassland, rocky, hills

**What is a landmark?** A landmark is object or feature of a landscape or town that is easily seen and recognised from a distance.

**Name a landmark in one of the continents.** Empire State Building, Eiffel Tower, Golden Gate Bridge, Sphinx

**Compare and contrast where you live to someone in a different country in a different continent. Describe some features of a different continent.**

### Vocabulary

<b>Continent</b>	Any of the world’s continuous expanses of land
<b>Physical feature</b>	A natural feature like river, hill, forest
<b>Human Feature</b>	A man-made feature like house, road, shop
<b>Land</b>	The part of Earth’s surface that is not covered by water
<b>Sea</b>	Salt water that covers most of the Earth’s surface
<b>Landmark</b>	An object or feature of a place which is easily recognised from a distance.
<b>Ocean</b>	A very large expanse of sea
<b>Political map</b>	A political map represents countries, states and towns. Often are painted different colours so we can see them better.
<b>Physical map</b>	A map of the locations of identifiable landmarks.
